HOW TO APPLY:

Make an application to Social Sciences Year 2 through the OUAC (Ontario Universities Application Centre) at www.ouac.on.ca/105. Using the OUAC application, a request can be made to send midyear Lambton transcripts to Huron electronically. Please watch for the prompts and carefully note the timelines for sending transcripts. To be considered for January, please apply directly to Huron by completing Huron's online application.


ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Graduate of Lambton's 2-year Liberal Studies program;
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3 or B+;
- No grade less than "C" (or 2.0 GPA); and
- Completion of the required prerequisite courses.

HURON AWARDS AUTOMATIC SCHOLARSHIPS STARTING AT 80%.

AVERAGE	SCHOLARSHIP
80-81.99%	\$500 per year
82-84.99%	\$1,000 per year
85-89.99%	\$1,500 per year
90%+	\$2,000 per year

- Scholarships are assessed using final cumulative average as calculated by Huron
- This award is renewable for three additional years, provided that you maintain a minimum average of 80% on 5.0 courses in each regular academic term (September to April) as a Huron Student



HURON PROGRAM MODULES

Within the Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences, Huron offers numerous specializations, majors and minors. Second year courses at Huron may require a prerequisite course taken during your studies at Lambton.

The chart lists which courses offered at Lambton can be used for the progression requirements of the program of interest. If you have not taken the required course at Lambton, you still have the option of taking it at Huron when you begin your studies.

Step 1

Accept your Offer

After you have received an Offer of Admission, you must respond on OUAC by the deadline provided in your offer package.

Step 2

Meet Your Admission Conditions

If you are currently registered at Lambton College, you will have admission conditions that must be met to retain your offer. These conditions will be listed in your Offer of Admission.

Step 3

Submit Final Official Transcript

Once you have completed the Liberal Arts Diploma, you must request to have an official transcript sent to Huron's Admission Office.
Once the final transcript is received and admission conditions are met, you will have your transfer credit and scholarship amount finalized.

Step 4

Register for a Summer Orientation & Academic Registration SOAR Session

Once you have accepted your offer, you can register for a SOAR Session to select your courses. These sessions are hosted in June and July and are designed for students to select courses, meet fellow classmates and learn about Huron's Support Services. If you are starting in January, you will be contacted for a registration date in December.
