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## FAQs

### How will the theory courses of my program be delivered?

Theory courses will be delivered online. Students will engage in online theory courses by viewing/listening to lectures and/or participating in Microsoft Teams meetings. Professors will post the online format for each class in D2L.

### How will my communications or general education courses be delivered?

If the classes are theory courses, they will also be delivered online.

### What can I expect during the practical lab component of my program?

The practical lab components of the course will be held on campus. The majority of labs will be held in the OPTA lab but the professors will likely also utilize the nursing lab, simulation apartment and the massage lab. The lab classes may be divided in to lab sections in order to abide by social distancing rules.

### How many days will I need to be on campus?

The lab schedule is currently being determined.

In term 2, first-year students have two lab courses (OPA-2003 & OPA 2023) with the labs lasting two hours each. Students will be expected to be on campus twice per week.

In term 4, second-year students, have mainly theory courses but may be expected to be on campus at the end of the term for Capstone Consolidation presentations. As well, students may be meeting occasionally for the Case Study Consolidation Course.

### How has the clinical part of my program been affected?

First-year students have no clinical placements.

In term 4, Second-year students have field placements scheduled March 15 until April 16. At this point, clinical placements are expected to proceed. If this changes, students will be notified as soon as possible. The program is working on a contingency plan if this were to occur.

### What additional supplies are recommended for my program? Will I need a new laptop/webcam/microphone?

It is recommended that you have a laptop with a webcam and microphone.
